

Ashley Lehmann, Kennel Technician, described the experience as being much like that at Christmas time. Collectively, we couldn't agree more! Denise Jones, Senior Operations Manager, was excited to give the greenlight on outdoor enrichment for several of the South Korean rescues after they successfully completed quarantine.

"They are still learning that the human hand is safe...they are still learning that people are safe and care for them!" Says Denise. "We are going to continue to move at their pace, while next steps will include the necessary routine medical treatment to prepare them for adoption." Deshawnta, Vanly, and Ashley worked gently with the dogs to move them from their kennels to the outdoor play yard for the first time. As their sweet paws touched the soil and their noses planted in the grass, their tails went to wagging...and in an instant they were running FREE, without a leash—a moment they had never experienced before! Yes, tears flowed and hearts were elated.

What Is in Your Food?

Do the words *food additives* conjure images of chemical names with at least five syllables, concocted in a laboratory far from the amber waves of grain? People have been adding things to food for thousands of years. Salt has been used to preserve meat and fish. Vinegars made from apples and grapes have pickled everything from cucumbers to mushrooms. Herbs and spices have added variety and taste to all kinds of foods. So what is a food additive? A food additive is any substance added to food in its production, processing, treatment, packaging, transportation, or storage.

Of the thousands of substances that are used to preserve or enhance food, the three most common ones aren't obscure chemicals; they're salt, sugar, and corn syrup. In addition to flavoring food, food additives preserve what people eat in more modern fashion, keeping bread from going moldy and salad dressing from becoming rancid. Additives also help cakes rise, improve the nutritional value of cereals and baked goods, and prevent salt from becoming lumpy.

Before an additive makes it into the kitchen, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) puts it through extensive testing. The FDA reviews many new food and color additives each year, testing them for safety and effectiveness. After a new additive has been approved, the FDA publishes regulations identifying the types of foods in which the additive can be used, the maximum amounts that may be used, and how the additive must be identified on food labels.

Most food additives are safe for almost everyone. Because foods containing additives make up a substantial part of the food supply, it pays to know more about these additives. With the proper information, you can select the foods you think are best for you and your family and avoid those you'd prefer not to consume, especially if you or someone you shop for has food sensitivities or allergies...

Kennel Quarantine LIFTED: The South Korean dogs have been medically cleared! **This does not mean they can be walked yet.** We are working on a plan for socializing them and will send that plan out as soon as we complete it. You can now walk through the kennels to get through to the main shelter! Please be aware that some of them are still a little scared, so I recommend tossing some treats to them as you walk by and <u>do not stick your fingers in their kennels.</u> **Do not take photos and share them with friends/family or on social media – this is part of our confidentiality policy.**

Foster Animal of the Week: Meet Spirit! An adorable 13-week-old puppy who can to us from Georgia. Miss Spirit is recovering from a jaw fracture, but you'd never know since she doesn't let it bother her. She only needs a foster for about a week before she gets her recheck. Spirit is a typical puppy, and can be mouthy, whiney, and very energetic. She likes other dogs, but her energy is too much for some pups. If you want to give this gal a home for the next week, let me know! She is on medication for a non-contagious skin condition.



Volunteer Wing Entry: Now that quarantine is up, getting to the volunteer wing will be much easier.

In the last week, we have had 32 adoptions (16 cats, 16 dogs)!
