

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

GOOD NEWS!!!

Ohio Puppy Mill Law, One Of the Strongest In the Nation, Is In Effect!

As of Friday September 28th, commercial breeders in Ohio can no longer cram dogs into cages that are stacked on top of each other and deprive animals of basic necessities, like space to move, exercise and access to veterinary care. This path breaking new law goes into effect upgrading standards of care for dogs kept in breeding kennels that churn out large numbers of puppies, also called puppy mills.

Under the new law, each dog must be: given daily exercise that allows the animal to extend to full stride, play and engage in other types of mentally stimulating and social behaviors, receive an annual veterinary exam, and be housed with other dogs in temperature-regulated kennels, among other reforms.

The law also mandates that only healthy dogs can be bred, and limits the number of times a female dog can be bred. It requires retailers selling puppies in Ohio to acquire animals solely from breeders who meet these standards, regardless of what state they are in! After 2021, the law will ban wire flooring and will require an increase in the size of the kennels.
