We are excited about expanding our reach in the community and connecting with a segment of our local population that would otherwise be missed. Sandra has such a great personality and is extremely professional; we are thrilled to have her on our team as the Spanish Communications Liaison Volunteer. Abel is a huge animal lover and is super talented, lending immense support to our cause. The SPCA looks forward to what we will accomplish together!




#ICYMI: Spectrum News1Visits the SPCA!
